# Day 1 - Wednesday, July 24, 2024

### Compliance Track:

### New Managers Bootcamp (Sessions 1-4)

### Management Track:

### HUD Disaster Management (Sessions 1&2)

### **NSPIRE (Sessions 1-4)**

Participants will learn about the three new inspection areas (Inside, Outside, and Units), understand the REAC NSPIRE scoring model, and compare UPCS and NSPIRE scoring. The course also covers using the NSPIRE Scoring Calculator, identifies deficiencies with a grace period starting 10/1/24, and clarifies which deficiencies do not affect scores. Additionally, attendees will learn about the number of sample units to be inspected and the highest-scoring deficiencies to avoid. This training is essential for staying compliant and maintaining high property standards.

### **Residents Services Track:**

### **Mental Health Crisis Planning**
